F.Y. B.A. course on Gandhian Thought:

<u>G1 : Introduction to Gandhian Thought.</u>

(Objective: To introduce to the student the life-sketch, personality and the thought of Mahatma Gandhi. The approximate duration of each unit will be 12 lectures)
